I. Background Information on GIAff4ID

What is the GIAff4ID Project?

The GIAff4ID project is based on the idea of breaking stereotypes around sexual education and affectivity of Young Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (YPWIDs) based on the developments of a games-based learning approach. This approach provides high-quality education, and allow to spread information in a way that takes into consideration different abilities and learning needs, by creating content that is customizable to varied abilities, and can be adapted to different backgrounds and contexts. This project will contribute dismenteling exisitng barriers around sexual education for YPWIDs. In this way, YPWIDs are encouraged to take decisions concerning how they relate to their bodies and emotions independently.

Project background

The issue of sexual health and education in disability is often discussed with the concept of negative liberty, in which rights are expressed as an absence of external restraints or obligations. This means that sexual rights for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities (PWID) are mostly debated in the context of protection from abuse, exploitation, or violence.

While these themes are very important, this type of discourse excludes fundamental aspects that allow PWID to take informed decision on their lives and experiencing their own sexuality. Sexual education is, in this light, a key instrument to enable young PWID to become their own - or their peers'-advocates on the subject, making sure that their voices and needs are heard.

Project aims and objectives

GIAff4ID's general objective is to provide youth workers with adaptable tools to offer relevant Sexual and Affectivity education to YPWID. The materials developed will be of relevance because will stem from YPWID's needs and expectations, and will be suitable for different learning abilities.

The aim of this project is to develop games on various themes connected to sexual education like consent, health practices, emotions and affectivity, and physical changes. This games-based learning approach allow to take into account of different learning abilities, and will be accompanied by on instructional materials for their implementation, with the goal of fostering inclusion and awareness on the subject.

In order to make sure that young PWID's needs are met, and that the activities of the projects fit their requirements, it is important to include their participation as much as possible, while training youth workers on how to best implement the materials created. Starting from the everyday experiences on the subject of Sexual Education of young PWIDs, the objective is to create inclusive and adaptable materials for youth workers that want to engage them on the subject.

Why interview YPWID by youth workers in the context of GIAff4ID?

This is essential in order to directly involve YPWIDs and youth workers in the project. It also helps to create a sense of ownership that ultimately promotes the dissemination, impact and sustainability of the project. In particular, conducting these interviews:

- It allows for the collection of crucial information and a more in-depth analysis of the sex education themes that are fundamental to YPWID;
- It helps to disseminate the project among youth workers and other stakeholders who may be interested in further activities within the project;
- It helps to achieve the desired impact by making GIAff4ID relevant to the needs of the target groups;
- It contributes to the creation of a network of experts who can support the development of the whole project and further exploit its results.

II. Process of the interviews

Who can conduct the interview/ be interviewed?

Each partner will select two youth workers to conduct the interviews. These youth workers should have demonstrated their interest and motivation to participate in the project and should be familiar with the themes and general objectives of the project. Each partner is responsible for informing the youth workers about the project.

In total 6 YPWIDs will be interviewed. Among them, gender balance should be respected as well diversity in sexual orientation so as to promote full inclusion. YPWIDs should be aged 12-17 years so as to capture the project's target group. Each partner will monitor the results of the interviews and ensure that this document is properly completed. Together with the desk research, the interviews are crucial support material for the further activities of the project, including the elaboration of the national and European report, as well as for the development of the toolkit.

How to conduct the interview?

The interview can be conducted either in person or remotely. In the first case, read carefully the questions before the interview in order to be prepared for eventual clarifications that the interviewee may need on the Project. In the second case, it is possible to send the template by e-mail or conduct a voice/video interview. When sending it by email, fill in the 'Contact' field. When conducting it by voice/video interview, it is advisable to first check the technical requirements.

The material below serves as a guidance to the interviwer. Flexibility is recommended. It is possible to use different methods in order to accommodate your interlocutor's needs.

Objectives of the interview

The objective of the interview is to collect needs, expectations, and levels of knowledge on the subject on the topic of Sexuality and Affectivity by YPWID. The interview's results will serve as support working materials to develop other deliverables of the project, including a European and National reports, as well as the Toolkit.

The interview will take around 60 minutes

Consent Forms & Recording

The interviewer and the interviewee must before any further steps duly complete the consent forms.

The data collected and this supporting material may not be used for any purpose other than internal data collection to support the creation of the deliverables under this GIAff4ID project.

If you plan to record the interview, make sure to first inform the interviewee and ask him/her to sign in the data protection and image release policy templates.

Reporting the interviews

When the interview is conducted in person or via voice/video conference, the interview may be conducted in English or in the language of the country. The report of the interview however has to be transcribed in English. Full interview transcripts are not a necessary requirement, it is however recommended to transcribe at least key passages of the interviews. Make sure that no relevant piece of information provided by the interviewee is omitted in the template.

Adapt the interviews to your interlocutor

The background of the interviewee has to be taken into consideration for the involvement into this activity. Underline which is his/her experience and expertise and what contribution can be relevant for the development of the project's activities.

Involve the interviewee in other Project's activities

At the end of the interview, ask the interviewee to take part in other Project's activities.








Question 15: Do you know what does sexual orientation and gender mean?


